When does the school's responsibility for pupils' positive behaviour begin and end?

We would say it's not just between 8:45am and 3:15pm, and it's not just up until the end of Year 6.

We want to make sure that we give children the best possible start to the rest of their lives, so we care about their attitudes and behaviours outside of school and into secondary school too.

We especially care about helping children behave well online, as this is an area that can be hard to monitor. We want to make sure that children treat other people with respect at school, at home, outside and online.

It has been a concern to me recently that children in Year 6 are speaking to each other unpleasantly online, when I know they would never speak to each other like that face-to-face. I talk to them about the way I behave online and hope that they will accept responsibility for themselves.

The five strands of our strategic plan are:

- Metacognition (children understanding their learning journey) 'We learn well'
- o Interaction (all of us speaking, listening and communicating effectively) 'We speak well'
- Writing (using extensive vocabulary, correct grammar and punctuation) 'We write well'
- Collaboration (partnering with others to improve what we do) 'We work together'
- Aspiration (bringing the best out in each other and aiming high) 'We are inspired'
