Being a parent is hard, isn't it?

I would imagine that different people would say different things about what is hardest, but for me, the hardest thing is when a child has a tantrum about something - or completely refuses to do what has been asked of them.

If this happens, it is virtually impossible to reason with the child. So how do we handle this?

The answer is to do lots of work to avoid this happening in the future.

Most toddlers have tantrums, but most children grow out of this as they get older, because they learn what works and what doesn't.

If children learn that by having tantrums, screaming and shouting, they get want they want, they will carry on screaming and shouting.

It's hard for parents to stick to what they have said when they can see that it makes their child really upset, but we should stay strong, because we know it's right and best for the future.

The five strands of our strategic plan are:

- o Metacognition (children understanding their learning journey) 'We learn well'
- o Interaction (all of us speaking, listening and communicating effectively) 'We speak well'
- Writing (using extensive vocabulary, correct grammar and punctuation) 'We write well'
- Collaboration (partnering with others to improve what we do) 'We work together'
- Aspiration (bringing the best out in each other and aiming high) 'We are inspired'
