What do you think makes the biggest difference to a child's success at school?

<u>Research</u> shows that it is <u>great teachers</u> that make the biggest difference.

I am pleased to say that we have great teachers here, and we also have great teachers that want to get even better at teaching. We have one staff meeting each week, in which we try to give teachers more information and more resources to help them. We also run optional extra sessions that teachers (and support staff) can come to if they want to develop their skills. These are well-attended, showing me that we have staff here that are determined to 'aim high' and 'do their best'.

The second most significant thing that helps children succeed is their own expectations of themselves and of their education. If children want to come to school and to learn because they love getting better at things, they will certainly be successful. So it's our job to make learning interesting and irresistible!
